


Light in the Midst of Darkness

The past three months have been tumultuous in Haiti. The gangs that control most of the capital city have moved into the more rural areas to claim more land. The area where the Ministry Center is located, is called Gressier. This small town is now under attack. Two months ago the local police station was seized and burned by the gangs. The police returned, reinforced and repelled the gangs, retaking the police station, and stabilizing the area. There have been increasing gun battles with the gangs retaking the police station and tearing it down. The police are pushing hard to retake the area and drive the gang back. That is the current situation as you read this newsletter. Please pray for the people as they are defenseless and caught in the middle. Many are evacuating, and going into the mountains. Food is very hard to find as one of the largest markets in the area was next to the police station. Even if they have the money to purchase food it is scarce.

Even though the area is in turmoil and fighting continues, we are blessed to share that only by the grace of God, Ministry continues to run full speed.






The Bible clubs continue to reach into the lives of the children. They continue to be fed physically, and spiritually each weekend, even though the turmoil mentioned earlier exists.
